## Starting or moving schools – Immunisation records

When your child starts school, you need to give the school your child's Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) Immunisation History Statement. This is required so that WA Health can provide support to parents/guardians of under-immunised children, as well as to enable schools to help reduce the spread of vaccine preventable diseases.

Please note that photocopies of the Vaccination Schedule from your Child Health Record Books are no longer accepted.

#### How do I get a copy of my child's AIR Immunisation History Statement?

A copy of your child's Immunisation History Statement is posted to you when your child completes their childhood immunisation schedule. You can also access a statement at any time by:

- logging into Medicare online via MyGov (https://my.gov.au)
- using the Medicare Express Plus app
   (www.humanservices.gov.au/customer/services/express-plus-mobile-apps)
- visiting a Medicare or Centrelink office, or
- calling the AIR General Enquiries Line on 1800 653 809

(For further information on getting your AIR Immunisation History Statement please use the link below to download the flyer)

When do I need to give the school my child's immunisation history? Whenever your child enrols, the law says that you must give the school your child's Immunisation History Statement. This includes enrolling your child into:

- a kindergarten program
- pre-primary
- secondary school
- a new school.

The votes were counted and Moonlight was our final winner!!!




# **Room 9 - Milo and Biscuit Day**

Room 9 decided as part of their Dairy learning journey they would run a fundraiser to sell a Milo and cow biscuits to raise money to go towards the paint and an excursion to the local dairy and ice cream factories, to further enhance their learning about dairy. Here they got to use two dairy products: butter and milk to make the cookies and Milo. We even did a sustainability spin on it and got students to bring their own cups in to reduce waste.



#### **Indonesian News Term 2**

This term the Year 3 and Year 4 students have been learning about *Nyepi*, a Hindu celebration mainly celebrated in Bali. They have learnt about the various intercultural aspects including Balinese Hindu beliefs, traditional clothing, family values and the roles of men and women. The activities based around this topic require the students to learn and use Indonesian for numbers, colours and parts of the face to describe *ogohogoh* (spirits), learn and use the names of traditional clothing, understand the meaning of this festival and reflect on their own traditions and festivals.





#### **Room 2 - Science in Year 1**

This term Miss Clarke is doing her final teaching practise in Room 2. She has been taking us for Science, focussing on features and habitats of bees, and also why bees are so important in our lives. We have used beeswax to make indigenous tools and we even got to taste bee pollen, honey and honeycomb. In Art we have made 3D robot bees with construction materials and then we have painted a background for the bee. There has been some great learning going on. Thanks Miss Clark!


