From the Principal's Desk

Throughout this term our staff have worked tirelessly to ensure students are learning in a happy and positive environment. We all know that school is the best place for students to learn. With the increasing cases of COVID across Western Australia we have instigated several strategies across the school to keep students safe and learning at school. These have included:

- Staff being fully vaccinated
- Ensuring there is appropriate ventilation and placing 12 air purifiers across the school. We even have a CO2 sensor to check on the oxygen levels of classrooms.
- Extra cleaning and disinfecting areas is occurring across the school.
- Students are kept together in year groups and classes so that if there was a positive case less people will need to quarantine.
- The provision of hand sanitiser in all classrooms.
- Parents staying out of classrooms.
- The introduction of masks for students in year 3-6. This will reduce those that would need to quarantine in the event of a positive case. It has been wonderful to watch staff use more outdoor spaces for learning and to have mask breaks across the school day.

Can I assure parents that our school is well prepared in the event there is a positive case. There are plans in place to support staff, students, and parents as we work with the Health Department. This includes the identification of close contacts and the quarantine of those that that are identified.

We have now set up a facility so that you will get text messages on mobile phones as well as Compass notifications.

When students are in home quarantine which is currently for 7 days, we have work packages for students to continue their learning. Teachers will communicate through Seesaw and there will be a weekly check-in of students through Zoom.

We are all in this together. It is important we all act calmly, stay positive and do our very best to keep things as normal as we can for our students and community.

We have several parents who generously donated funds to our school. These donations make an incredible difference for our students and allow us to purchase additional resources for students within our school and build up resources over the years. I would like to thank those families for their generosity. If you would like to donate to our school, please email or phone me to discuss.

Our Year 5 students have been working with our Art teacher Ms Verity Haines, in decorating several banners that will be used for the celebration of the Centennial of Group Settlement. The students have really enjoyed the project and finding out more about the history of group settlement. The celebration will occur in March and I look forward to seeing the finished banners.



Group Settlement


It was very exciting to find out the students elected to be Library Monitors in 2022. Congratulations to:




Jackson and Hayley learning the ropes.

We welcome New Parents & we encourage new & old members to join us by logging on. The Treasurer role will be open for anyone interested in taking on a position with full handover & ongoing support given.


Being part of the P&C, you can learn more about what is happening around the school and be more involved. As we like to say "Many Hands Make Light Work"
